## Vaccination availability in Door County expands

COVID vaccinations are now available through Door County Public Health to anyone age 12 and older, with or without an appointment. Walk-ins are welcome, although they are subject to vaccine availability; appointments are encouraged.

Susan Powers, RN, BSN, and health office/manager with the Public Health Division of the Door County Department of Health and Human Services, encourages all people eligible for the vaccine—which now includes youth ages 12–15—to get vaccinated.

“Children can still get sick with COVID-19 and can spread it to others, even if they do not have symptoms,” she explained. “The COVID-19 virus is always looking for a new person to infect—that is how it survives, and the reason why it spreads from person to person. By getting your child vaccinated, you will be protecting them from getting sick and reduce the chances of spreading the virus to others.”

Powers noted that for youth under age 18, a parent must sign a consent form and a responsible adult must accompany the child to the vaccine appointment. More information for parents is available at <https://www.dhs.wisconsin.gov/COVID-19/parents.htm>.

Door County vaccine clinics are held in Sturgeon Bay at the ADRC office (916 N. 14th Ave.) on Wednesdays from 3:30 to 6 p.m., and in Sister Bay at the fire station (2258 Mill Rd.) every third Thursday from 3:30 to 5 p.m.

Both clinics have the Pfizer vaccine for ages 12 and older and the Johnson and Johnson vaccine for ages 18 and over.
